RESPONSIBLE ANGLING EDUCATION PROGRAM

Our Responsible Angling Education Program (RAE) has been running for 15 years! Initially, the pandemic greatly impacted this program; however, our team was able to adapt and continue offering the immersive marine conservation classes that were held pre-pandemic. Our team harnessed the power of technology to provide a hybrid program as well as virtual learning opportunities with Ocean First Education. Although the landscape of teaching this program has changed, we continue to offer the most immersive and educational activities possible for our students.









AQUAPONICS FOOD SECURITY & EDUCATION PROGRAM

According to the Palm Beach County Food Bank, "more than 226,280 residents in Palm Beach County struggle with hunger, a 35% increase since 2018". In January of 2021, we launched this program because of the food supply chain issues caused by the COVID-19 pandemic as well as the growing need for environmental education in school systems. From providing fresh produce every week to local soup kitchens to providing additional environmental education opportunities to local youth, this program has the potential to make a substantial impact in Palm Beach County, and other communities to come.

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



Recently we acquired a 2-acre parcel of land in Loxahatchee, FL to serve as the future site of our aquaponics food production facility. Sitting adjacent to Lion Country Safari, we will be building a 20,000+ square foot aquaponics farm to expand our food security efforts throughout Palm Beach County. We will be seeking to raise \$1.5 million for this project.
